Although no preparation is required for the interview, a review of the questions that will be posed might be helpful.

1) Reflecting on your whole experience with St. James, please share a time you felt most engaged with the church. Who was involved? How did you feel? What made it meaningful to you?

2) Thinking again about your experience with St. James, please share a time you felt most connected to God. In what way did St. James help grow or foster that connection? What details do you recall from this time?

3) Please share a time you have seen the people of St. James connect positively with each other. What brought about that connection? What keywords would you use to describe the experience?

4) What are the central characteristics of our congregation? What makes St. James unique?

5) This last question asks you to imagine the future of our church. Please share two or three dreams you have for what God will accomplish through St. James. Describe what it will look like as those dreams come to be.

The Transition Team sincerely appreciates your willingness to be interviewed and help shape a bright and vibrant future for St. James.

From the Pastor

Your Transition Team has been hard at work since its first meeting at the end of February. The Team's focus is on listening: to God, to the people of St. James and to our neighbors. The Call Committee will be formed after the Transition Team completes its work.

Based on the listening and on other information gathered about St. James, the Transition Team will offer a picture of what the future of the congregation might look like: a "vision for mission". Using everything it has gathered, the Transition Team will complete a document called a Ministry Site Profile (MSP). The MSP describes the pastoral leadership that will be most helpful to walk alongside St. James toward God's future for the congregation.

Once the MSP is approved by the Council (around the end of September 2024), then a Call Committee will begin to meet. The Call Committee interviews pastoral candidates and brings its recommendation to the congregation for a vote about whether to extend a call to the pastor.

So we are on our way! Listening comes first, and here's how we will listen to the people of St. James:

Listening by Way of "Story Interviews"

During the month of May members of the Transition Team and the Council will interview around 100 people connected to St. James. Most will be members, but preschool parents and community meal participants will also be interviewed. ANYONE in the congregation who wants to be interviewed is welcome to sign up.

The five questions that will be used are published on the front page of this Jottings. You will see that we are looking for stories about positive ministry that has taken place through St. James over its whole history. There is also a question that invites your imagination about the future of the congregation. It is the Holy Spirit, celebrated this month at Pentecost, that prompts our imaginations about a future filled with God's grace and goodness.

The Transition Team will use the responses to the questions to arrive at a "vision for mission" shaped by our collective imaginations.

Receipts/Offerings

March Operating Envelopes Receipts are unfavorable to budget by (\$13,855) or -29% but slightly higher than the prior year March by \$414 or +1%. March YTD Operating Envelopes Receipts are unfavorable to budget by (\$21,270) or -14.8% and UP from the prior year by \$1,786 or +1.5%.

Seeds & Building Fund Account

March SEEDS contributions were lower at \$7,677 than the monthly mortgage payment of \$9,304. The budget is set up to fund the mortgage payments thru the general operating budget using the SEEDS contributions and any excess SEEDS contributions remain in the building fund money market to use when needed to cover a shortfall. The remaining balance in the Seeds/Building Fund account that is not specific to the mortgage reduction match is \$72,617 to be used if there is a shortfall to fund in 2024.

Expenses

Total general budget expenses for YTD March were favorable (less than budgeted expenses) by \$10,500. The main contributors to this favorable result are from the youth director budget dollars for \$7,000 favorable and the favorable timing of Office/Equipment Maintenance expense for \$2,000 YTD.

The overall takeaway for March is that for the 2nd month in a row we lost ground on the budget front with lower than expected March offerings but remain on track YTD in comparison to the prior year net results thru 3 months with 2024 YTD at a negative net of (\$10,411) compared to 2023 YTD net at a negative (\$24,484). However, we were behind budget net YTD of (\$289) by (\$10,122).

Mortgage Reduction Principal Payment News



Congratulations and Thank You! The Harlan Dahlk Memorial Mortgage Reduction Campaign was a success: the \$100,000 match was achieved, doubling the initial challenge contribution from the Harlan Dahlk Estate. This enables us to make a \$200,000 principal payment on our St. James mortgage. This is in thanks and appreciation to ALL of you who graciously contributed to the match campaign during the past six months.

What are the future benefits of this mortgage reduction principal payment?

In terms of dollars, because of your generosity, our mortgage balance was reduced from \$1.7 million down to \$1.5 million, giving us an additional future interest savings of approximately \$200,000 over the remaining term of the loan. This means every dollar donated by you was not only matched, it will double our future savings.

This reduction of our loan puts St. James in a much better place to manage the monthly payment stream in an increasing interest rate environment, allowing us to expand our ministries. The current favorable mortgage interest rate on our mortgage of 3.875% will last for three more years (until July, 2027), when it will reset to the ELCA Mission Investment Fund 5-year fixed interest rate in place at that time.

St. James will continue to make our current monthly payment of \$9,304, as approved in the 2024 budget, which allows for additional principal each month instead of reducing the payment by \$1,000/month now, only to then increase by \$1,600/ month in 2027, with the upward interest rate adjustment. Instead, the current payment is expected to increase by less than \$250/month in mid-2027, and our mortgage balance should be at \$1.3 million at that time.

When we began in 2013 to dream and plan for an expanded and renovated facility, our hope was to create a beautiful and useful space, enabling us better to live out our mission of receiving, growing, and giving in Christ. We knew the financial commitment would be significant, but God has blessed us with generous givers over the years. Thanks to your generosity, this \$200,000 in principal is a gift that keeps giving for years to come.

Our beautiful, renovated and expanded facilities, completed in 2017, offer a space to gather for worship, learning, conversation, play, and much more, not only for our community of faith, but for the wider community as well. From the dream to the design phase, through the initial capital campaign and construction, to a wisely-timed principal payment and refinancing in 2022, and now a major reduction in the mortgage principal, St. James has made prudent and wise decisions throughout the process. Thanks to all who have contributed so much, worked so hard, to make this all possible.


Men of St. James May 21 Event

ALL STUDENTS - Bring or wear shoes and clothing that are suitable for gardening.







From the Parish Nurse...

May has National Health Observances Physical Fitness, Mental Health, Older Adults, and Women's Health

When we look at these observances collectively, there is a common thread. That is one of movement and socialization. When we exercise we give off endorphins which alleviate pain, lower stress, improve mood and enhance your sense of well -being. That, in turn, enables better fitness at any age or sex, and can relieve anxiety.

Many adults, over the age of 55 experience some form of mental health concern with Depression and Anxiety being the most common. Loneliness and social isolation are associated with higher rates of depression, among other health complications.

Start walking, meet other walkers. See your physician about possible necessary medications. Try reaching out over the phone or social media. Depression is not a normal part of growing older.
